Essential Duties and Responsibilities

1. Qualification to drive, under both the DOT regulations and in the opinion of the company.
2. Conduct Pre-Trip and Post-Trip Safety Inspections and document, as required. Documentation is turned into Dispatcher daily.
3. Start engine, shift gears, press pedals and turn steering to operate truck.
4. Drive standard transmission truck to various job sites to load and offload materials.
5. Inspect and document lowboy trailer tires, lights, brakes, tarps, boards, and frame. Defects will be documented on Daily Inspection Log.
6. Maintain telephone contact with dispatcher to receive instructions. Cell phone use is only done when vehicle is parked and off the roadway.
7. Maintain a daily inspection log.
8. Must keep track of expiration date of his/her DOT physical card and CDL license.
9. If truck breaks down:
 - a. know exact location of where you are: street and/or road name, and job name. Call into dispatcher to let them know about truck being down.
 - b. know, roughly, what broke (e.g. airline, engine failure, or flat tire).
10. If job is completed early, must call dispatcher. Driver will be given a new assignment.
11. Load and secure multiple types of heavy equipment:
 - a. using chains and binders, equipment will meet standard legal requirements prior to leaving site.
 - b. put flags, warning lights, and signage in place prior to leaving site.
12. Required to climb in and out of equipment using the standard three-point contact method.
13. Driver must report immediately to the Dispatcher any traffic citations either in a company vehicle or in own personal vehicle.
14. Driver is responsible to maintain a positive personal appearance and to maintain the overall cleanliness of the truck

SKILLS, KNOWLEDGE, QUALIFICATIONS & EXPERIENCE:

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill and/or ability required. Less than high school education required; up to six months related experience and/or training. 2 years truck driving experience with at least 1 year driving a lowboy truck. Ability to apply commonsense understanding to carry out detailed but uninvolved written or oral instruction. Ability to deal with standardized situations with only an occasional or no variables, and the ability to follow directions to a job site.

Must have a Class A Commercial Driver's License and a current DOT medical card.
